Adding the township's Dial-a-Ride to the Prompt system is expected to reduce costs while increasing customer service.

ENHANCING DIAL-A-RIDE

On-demand transit remains a hot-button issue for North Township: Ridership continues to rise without any new sources of funding in sight.

North Township Trustee Frank Mrvan has been working for nearly two years to increase capacity, efficiency and customer service using the proceeds of a three-year grant, which amounts to \$600,000 per year.

Since the expansion of Dial-a-Ride was announced two years ago, Mrvan has cultivated unique partnerships with private companies to optimize township resources.

One of the most recent is an agreement with Prompt Ambulance owners Gary and Shar Miller to assist with communication between Dial-a-Ride customers and the township transportation center.

Two township employees began working at Prompt's state-of-the-art Highland communication center in mid-August. During normal business hours, the two should be able to answer most calls to Dial-a-Ride. When they can't meet the demand, Prompt's

NEW RIDERSHIP RULES

Changes are in-the-works for the North Township transit customers. Trips are being bundled to include multiple riders, which means users may get to their destinations up to an hour early.

If you need to cancel, please call as soon as possible. Three no-shows within 30 days means an individual is suspended from using Dial-a-Ride for a month.

dispatchers will pick up the slack.

"We have been faced with the challenge to sustain the rides for the duration of the grant, which ends in 2015," Mrvan said.

"With the assistance of other dispatchers at Prompt – who are on duty around the clock – every person who calls to schedule a ride will be talking to a live person and not an answering machine. This will make the service more efficient and user-friendly to those who depend on Dial-a-Ride."

NORTH TOWNSHIP SEEKS FAMILY FOR HABITAT FOR HUMANITY HOME

North Township Trustee Frank Mrvan is on the hunt for the perfect candidate to work with Habitat for Humanity to rehab a home on Tennessee with the idea of owning it and becoming part of the neighborhood.

"This is a home that definitely needs work, but will become a great addition to Hessville when it is repaired," Mrvan said. "Habitat for Humanity has the best thing going for people who want to have that pride of home ownership but, for whatever reason, haven't been able to make it happen."

Part of Habitat's requirement is that potential owners have the ability to contribute either through actual work on the home or at Habitat's Restore in Calumet Township. For those who are disabled, family members or friends can provide the sweat equity on their behalf.

North Township took title to the home from the Lake County Commissioner's tax sale with the idea of helping a family find a home while repairing an unloved home for the community.

Dan Klein, executive director of Habitat for Humanity of Northwest Indiana, said the agency will be repairing the roof to keep it watertight for the winter until a suitable candidate is found.

"We all hope by this time next year, there will be a family living in this home," Mrvan said.

TRANSPORTATION PARTNERSHIP

Individuals interested in a career as a big-rig operator should know there are still opportunities through North Township, which participates in a Transportation Partnership with Ivy Tech, Driveco, Schneider National and the Holistic Community Coalition.

North Township Trustee Frank Mrvan said the unique partnership has expanded access to good-paying jobs. "We provide assistance in the short-term but have always made it our goal to help individuals become self-sufficient," Mrvan said. "People are happier when they are able to provide for themselves."

PURDUE CAL ELECTRICAL PROGRAM

A collaboration between the North Township Trustee's office and Purdue University Calumet is opening the doors for those seeking a career as an industrial electrician.

As part of a Department of Labor grant, Purdue Calumet will offer a 21-week course to prepare individuals for careers in advanced manufacturing. Known as Project AWAKE, the training program is free to qualifying individuals. The Department of Labor is investing \$2.7 million in the program, which is designed for veterans, workers affected by foreign trade job loss as well as those in manufacturing who desire advanced certification.

"This is a wonderful opportunity for individuals in our community to get the training they need to qualify for good paying jobs, which are available right here in the township," Trustee Frank Mrvan said. "Individuals who complete the course receive certification as well as 12 credit hours from Ivy Tech."

BRICKLAYER APPRENTICE PROGRAM

When the International Union of Bricklayers and Allied Craftworkers Local 4 open their apprenticeship program in February, East Chicago's Makesha Jones plans to be one of the first in line.

Jones, 29, heard about the possibility of becoming a bricklayer's apprentice through the North Township Trustee's office, which is collaborating with the union on education and training programs that lead to full-time employment.

"I had never thought about a career as a bricklayer but was intrigued when I heard about it," she said. "This is something I am really interested in and a career that could provide a good, livable wage."

Bricklayers representative Pete Severson said there has been quite a bit of interest in the apprenticeship program since he spoke to a group from North Township in July. "We take applicants twice a year. We start them off by teaching them how to use a trowel and then have them show some mastery of it," Severson said. "We have an apprentice board that evaluates how they are doing to see if they have promise. Those that pass move on to the math-and-ruler test and a full interview."

Although he can't imagine getting rich as a bricklayer, Severson said it is the kind of job that allows a family to live comfortably and even put a couple of children through college.

"There are many avenues for bricklayers once they become journeyman.
You can travel anywhere in the country as long as you remain certified."

Want to become an emergency medical technician or pharmaceutical tech?

North Township has teamed up with Work One, the state agency charged with retraining the workforce for today's employers. Circle of Services Coordinator Cindy Rivera said North Township has been working with Work One to create opportunities for township residents looking at career advancement.

"We had a class of 15 last year who were trained as patient access coordinators," she said. "One-by-one, they are getting hired for jobs that pay a living wage."
