SENIOR OUTREACH PROGRAM

North Township Trustee Frank Mrvan is prepared for whatever this winter offers up.

With predictions for a colder and snowier winter than normal, Mrvan has the football teams from Clark, Morton and East Chicago Central ready to be mobilized to take care of emergency snow removal at the homes of individuals who cannot do it for themselves.

In addition, the Trustee's office will be making well-person checks via phone throughout the winter to ensure that seniors and those who are homebound are safe and secure.

"It's easy to sign up," Mrvan said. "When temperatures dip and the snow starts to fall, we'll be making calls to everyone on our list. If we can't contact people on our list, we will notify the appropriate officials in Whiting, Hammond, East Chicago, Highland or Munster." ▲

LAST CHANCE TO SAVE ON ENERGY BILLS

If you haven't yet scheduled your free energy assessment through Energizing Indiana, you have only a few more weeks to take advantage of the opportunity to find ways you can save on your energy bills.

The program, which is scheduled to conclude Dec. 31 or whenever funding is exhausted, is a collaboration between the Indiana Office of Utility Consumer Counselor and utilities around the state.

Energy saved since the program began in 2012 is sufficient to fully power more than 100,000 homes for a full year.

North Township Trustee Frank Mrvan will be sorry to see the program end.

DIAL-A-RIDE BOOMING

Transit ridership has quadrupled to a whopping 48,000 rides since 2012.

North Township Trustee Frank Mrvan said the new partnership with Prompt Ambulance's Highland dispatch center and a new system of bundling rides has allowed the township to keep pace with demand.

"The challenge now is to find a permanent source of funding for this vitally needed program," Mrvan said. "We have shown just how badly a unified transportation system is needed in our communities. We are looking to secure permanent funding through federal, state and local sources."

LETTER FROM THE NORTH TOWNSHIP TRUSTEE

From our memorial ride to a new parade, we proudly salute our brave veterans

I was honored to be part of the first Veterans Day parade in Hammond. A little more than a month after our Victory for Veterans Memorial Ride attracted nearly 3,000 participants and raised money to help rehab a home for a veteran in Hammond, this inaugural march was another perfect way to honor our soldiers. The parade was about patriotism and respect for our military.

I was heartened seeing people standing along Hohman Avenue to reflect and remember those who have served; in the big wars and the smaller skirmishes; protecting our borders and defending those around the globe who can’t do the job for themselves.

The cloudy skies and cool temperatures were a great reminder of what we ask of America’s bravest men and women. We ask them to sacrifice personal comfort, jobs and families back home in the worst possible conditions to protect and defend the freedoms we hold dear.

Every day, there are about 500 brave young men and women who enlist in the Army, Navy, Marines, Coast Guard or Air Force.

Today, we have nearly 1.4 million Americans who are on active duty in the armed forces and another 851,000 who are attached to a reserve unit – more than 2 million Americans

WINTER ASSISTANCE

ENERGIZING INDIANA

In three short years, Energizing Indiana has resulted in vast reductions in energy consumption while saving homeowners and business owners millions of dollars.

The program provides home energy assessments to find long-term energy savings. Advisers assess heating, ventilation and air-conditioning as well as air duct seals and insulation levels to determine a home's energy consumption and efficiency.

The assessment may include replacing traditional light bulbs, installing low-flow faucet aerators/shower heads as well as water heater insulation.

- ❖ Every assessment generates a comprehensive report detailing savings opportunities.
- ❖ Eligible dwellings must be 10 years or older and have not been assessed in the last three years.
- ❖ Weatherization services are available for income-qualified homeowners.

SHOVELING ASSISTANCE

North Township wants to match seniors, who need help digging out, with volunteers, who have a shovel or snowblower. During periods of heavy snow, the township implements an automated call system to help those who are snowed-in and need help to get out of their homes.

WINTERIZATION KITS

The North Township Trustee's office is offering vouchers to keep out winter's chill. Eligible residents can use one \$40 voucher per month – December through February – to purchase items at Menard's stores that conserve energy and heat. Most popular are window insulation kits and draft stoppers.

North Township is continuing to work with Buddies Pet Pantry to provide pet food, pet supplies and toys for those who cannot afford it. About 1,200 pounds of pet food is distributed to township residents each month. "Our mission is to keep families and their pets together," said Cheryl Plomann, founder of Best Buddies Pet Pantry. "North Township is one of our biggest clients and we are happy to help." The food is available to North Township residents who meet income criteria.
