STAMP OUT POVERTY

Helping those most in need in North Township is going to ramp up and change direction next year in an all-out effort to stamp out poverty, stabilize families and communities.

Providing help to those who have nowhere else to go will be bolstered by efforts to assist those who live at the margins – perpetually unstable but just above the danger zone.

North Township Trustee Frank Mrvan said the stability of Northwest Indiana communities is at stake.

“By gearing up to be more proactive, we are developing strategies to prevent chaos in fragile families,” Mrvan said. “Intervening earlier will shorten the window to recovery and provide

additional stability for struggling communities and their residents.”

The township has joined forces with Lake Area United Way to learn more about the Alice Study of Financial Hardship, which details the whys of perpetual financial instability.

It will be up to the townships, which serve as the community’s safety net, to develop solutions.

“We are working with educators, employers, social services and the faith-based community,” he said. “My hope is when we talk about this a year from now we will see new employment opportunities and career-training initiatives that are making a difference for our families who need it most.”

EDGE OF SURVIVAL

Data shows poverty in Lake County is not a choice, but the result of too little income to make ends meet. Those living at the margins employ short-term strategies that have long-term consequences, such as: skipping medications, meals or failing to make critical bill payments.

Trustee Frank Mrvan is working with the county’s 10 other townships to create an integrated system that’s more effective.

Integral to the initiative is a Lake Area United Way study known as “Edge of Survival.”



ERIN’S LAW SHINES LIGHT ON CHILDHOOD SEXUAL ABUSE

The woman who brought national attention to childhood sexual assault is coming to North Township March 17.

Named by PEOPLE magazine as one of 15 women changing the world, Illinois resident Erin Merryn, has championed legislation aimed at protecting children from sexual abuse and exploitation.

Already 28 states, including Indiana, have made Erin’s Law their own. North Township Trustee Frank Mrvan would

like to see the law – which mandates sexual abuse awareness in all public schools – enacted in every state.

“Erin’s story breaks down barriers and opens communication,” he said.

National data shows 3 out of 4 abused adolescents are violated by someone they know well. “Lake County statistics on child sexual abuse are alarming,” Mrvan said. “It is important we are on the forefront to protect our children.”

NORTH TOWNSHIP TRUSTEE URGES FAMILIES TO GET TESTED FOR LEAD

Trustee Frank Mrvan is marshaling local resources to urge East Chicago residents to get tested for lead exposure.

Robocalls began in October to city residents impacted by excessively high lead levels in the soils around the West Calumet neighborhood.

Since lead findings were made public in August, the township has been helping those impacted by the health threat.

“Every child in East Chicago needs to be tested,” Mrvan said. “It’s a simple pin-prick. Testing is accessible and it is free. The good news is: medication is available to reverse the situation as is dietary assistance to help parents know what foods eliminate lead from the body. Environmental

physicians are also available to help with more complex cases.

“They can’t help, though, until people are tested,” he said. “While the local and state health departments address medical needs, the township is addressing this man-made disaster through awareness to prevent lifelong problems.”

... by cementing plans for permanent funding for Dial-a-Ride. We have done the best we can with grants and other temporary funding resources. It is time to secure permanent funding for our on-demand buses that serve more than 50,000 township residents a year.
